

## Progress notes

June 2009



Proposed route for cyclists and walkers linking Potter Heigham, Ludham, Horning and Hoveton/Wroxham with a riverside loop along the River Thurne

- The Three Rivers Way Association had an information display in St Benet's Hall, The Green, Horning on the morning of the Three Rivers Race , Sat 30<sup>th</sup> May 2009
- The Three Rivers Way Association's first AGM on 28<sup>th</sup> April 2009 was attended by over 40 people. The 3RWA Constitution was amended in accordance with requirements from Entrust to enable registration as an environmental body so that funding applications to Landfill Tax Credit grants can be made
- A funding application submitted to Veolia for £50K as part funding for the Hoveton to Horning section has been unsuccessful as the path was considered to be part of the public highway.
- EEDA's Inspire East enabling service is supplying us with five day's time from consultant Peter Hardy
- A planning session for 3RWA will be held on Tues 30<sup>th</sup> June with key partners to plan how to progress the project and get some firm commitments from partners to move forward.
- A forthcoming meeting with NCC Planning and Transportation will discuss the development of the A1062 road as a Self Explaining Route, a Norfolk Rural Demonstration Project.
- The consultation about the Compartment 6 flood alleviation works along the Thurne bank includes the Three Rivers Way proposal and will take place in June. Please include the Three Rivers Way route in your comments.
- Consultation about site specific proposals of the Local Development Framework will take place in June and provide an opportunity to raise the issue of cycling and walking routes.
- Local county elections and European elections take place on June 4<sup>th</sup>. We have lobbied candidates in the County elections about active travel routes and the Three Rivers Way in particular.
- Corinna Luther from the Dept of Environmental Sciences at UEA is undertaking research into the sustainable tourism potential of the route.
- Joe Jackson, a filmmaker from Potter Heigham, is making a DVD for use with potential funders.
