



Progress notes March 2010

Proposed route for cyclists and walkers linking Potter Heigham, Ludham, Horning and Hoveton/Wroxham with a riverside loop along the River Thurne

- The Environment Agency has agreed funding of £5,000 to buy in the fundraising expertise required to secure funding for sections of the route. Following this NNCP has agreed to the contribution of £4952. A tripartite group is being established to oversee the process.
- The AGM of the Association is on Tues 20th April 2010 at St Benet's Hall, Horning. Note change of venue. Rob Marshall of Cycling England is the speaker. All are welcome to attend.
- The Association received help from Stalham with Happing in February for the printing of the third issue of the newsletter *Way Ahead* sent to 1200 supporters.
- The Association will have a stand from 11.00 at St Benet's Hall Horning on 50th Three Rivers Race Day Sat 5th June 2010.
- The Association will exhibit at the Ludham Arts and Crafts event on Sat 1st, Sun 2nd and Mon 3rd June 2010 at St Catherine's Church Ludham.
- Comments on the NCC Rural Demonstration Project (the Self Explaining Route proposals for the A1062 Rural Route) made by the Association resulted in amendments to the proposal and inclusion of the needs of walkers and cyclists.
